



LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



On February 25th, 1981, nineteen young men made a decision to found a new fraternity. In starting Lambda Phi Epsilon, our Founding Fathers hoped to encourage personal growth, empower our communities, and create an extended family for men of Asian descent. Who could have imagined that on that date, they would be setting the foundation for all of us today?

Forty years later, Lambda Phi Epsilon maintains a presence on over 50 campuses, with over 500 current collegiate members, and over 10,000 alumni across Canada and the United States. As we move into 2021 and beyond, I invited you to continue with us on the journey our Founders started.

"Recalibrating Resilience" reverberated as a central theme for 2020. The International Board framed intentional conversations around the people, purpose, and potential of the fraternal experience. Despite the uncertainty of navigating a pandemic, the International Fraternity leadership determined the following shared priorities that will shape the course of the organization over the next two years:

- Elevate Standards: By improving advising, enforcing reporting, and raising the bar on fraternal standards, we set the organization for measured excellence.
- Uplift Community: In building awareness and advocacy for social justice, cultural, and philanthropic initiatives, we remain a relevant institution for developing the next generation of Leaders Among Men.
- Modernize Messaging: By developing an accessible forum for members to facilitate discussion and professional networking, we increase our accountability with the general public, partner organizations, and our membership.
- **Grow Sustainably:** We secure the long-term viability of the International Fraternity by scaling our active membership count with the expansion of new locations, promotion of rising chapters, reinstatement of dormant chapters, and development of chapters in good standing.
- Advance Alumni: Providing relevant programming and event opportunities to the largest segment of Lambda Phi Epsilon fraternity members will strengthen alumni ties to the Fraternity beyond their graduation.

Guiding the development of our committed officers as they scale the impact of their contributions to our membership at large has been of my favorite aspects of serving on the International Board. As Lambda Phi Epsilon Fraternity's 20th International President, I have been blessed to lead a board of courageous, confident, and compassionate leaders who stood tall amid swift and difficult decisions.

Despite the pain and trauma uncovered in 2020, our adversity does not define our future. By recalibrating resilience, we determine the direction of the fraternity by the ways we bounce back better, brighter, and bolder.

HISTORY OF THE FRATERNITY



Lambda Phi Epsilon was founded on February 25, 1981 by a group of nineteen dedicated men led by Principal Founder Master Craig Ishigo. The goal of the founders was to transcend the limitations faced by traditional Asian-interest organizations on campus. While these organizations were often split along lines of national origins, the founders sought an establishment that drew its membership equally from the different segments of the Asian American community. Their vision was that the members would eventually become the leaders of their respective ethnic communities, and thus, bridge the gaps fragmenting the Asian American community through their affiliation with a common organization.

The greatest hurdle in reaching this goal of unification was the lack of continuity among the memberships inherent in traditional campus organizations. At best, student associations provided a circle of friends spanning the years of undergraduate study, and at worst, a group of familiar strangers meeting periodically at social functions. The yearly turnover of most organizations' officers made it extremely difficult to pursue any extended project as each new officer core set its own agenda. The founders' solution to this dilemma was the adoption of a fraternal structure. By forming Lambda Phi Epsilon as a new Asian-interest fraternity, they aimed to set new standards of excellence for Asian American organizations. The brothers not only formed strong bonds of brotherhood with each other during their undergraduate experience but also made lifelong commitments to the organization as alumni even after graduation.

While the initial charter was comprised of Asian Pacific Americans, the brotherhood was open to all who were interested in supporting these goals. **Establishing Alpha Chapter at UCLA, Mr. Craig Ishigo**

and Mr. Darryl L. Mu signed the charter as President and Vice President, respectively.

On May 28th, 1990, the fraternity, now with six chapters total, convened on the campus of the University of California, Irvine for the first annual National Convention, which to this day has been held regularly over Memorial Day weekend. A national governing body was established to oversee the development of individual chapters and the fraternity as a whole, with Mr. Robert Mimaki of Beta Chapter, Mr. Eric Naritomi of Epsilon Chapter, and Mr. Doug Nishida of Delta Chapter appointed as National President, Northern Governor and Southern Governor, respectively.



On September 8th, 1990, Lambda Phi Epsilon reached another milestone and became the first and only nationally recognized Asian-interest fraternity in the United States with the admission to the National Interfraternity Conference. In 2004, Lambda Phi Epsilon expanded as an international fraternity by chartering its first chapter outside of the United States at the University of Toronto. In 2006, Lambda Phi Epsilon joined the National Asian Pacific Islander Desi American Panhellenic Association to increase collaboration and partnership between fellow APIDA Greek organizations.

Today, Lambda Phi Epsilon is widely renowned as the preeminent international Asian-interest fraternal organization, providing outstanding leadership, philanthropy, and advocacy in the community.

Emily also serves as a volunteer on the Kappa Delta National Leadership Team where she is the University Case Manager responsible for membership reviews and managing chapter university proceedings.

MEET DEAN PHAM, THE FIRST LAMBDA PHI EPSILON LEGAL INTERN


The law firm of Tran Arrowsmith PLLC and Lambda Phi Epsilon International Fraternity, Inc. announced the first legal intern under the Lambda Phi Epsilon Legal Internship Program: Dean Pham, a second-year law student at Western State College of Law.

The semester-long Internship will strategically expose the Intern to various aspects of Tran Arrowsmith's practice areas, including fraternal governance, campus recognition, judicial hearings, vendor contracts, as well as member misconduct and response. The Intern will also have collaborative opportunities to assist with various litigation matters, including name changes and claims of discrimination in employment, places of public accommodation, housing, and education.



INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY KEYNOTE

In honor of International Women's Day on March 8, 2021, Lambda Phi Epsilon International Fraternity, Inc. hosted Maisha Land for a public keynote addressed to its membership and the broader community. Land is the Greek Visionary behind the movement that brought unity among historically Black and Asian Greek organizations to get out the vote during the 2020 US Presidential Election. The viral campaign resulted in a record turnout of Black and APIDA voters.



SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH

In April 2021, the leadership of Lambda Phi Epsilon International Fraternity, Inc. (LFE) and Delta Epsilon Psi National Fraternity, Inc. (DEPsi) established a strategic partnership centered on sexual assault awareness and prevention to extend educational opportunities to both their membership and the community at large. As the largest Asian and South Asian-interest fraternities of the National APIDA Panhellenic Association (NAPA), LFE and DEPsi utilized their expansive reach on college campuses to voice their support for survivors and engage their chapters through the National Sexual Violence Resource Center's #30DaysofSAAM Challenge.

Both fraternities hosted behavioral scientist Laura M. Mercer Kollar, Ph.D. from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in a virtual seminar promoting sexual assault awareness. The event took place on April 25th, 2021, with over 200 attendees consisting of delegates from both organizations, members of the NAPA community, and various institutional partners from the broader fraternity and sorority life advising community. Dr. Kollar, alumnae of alpha Kappa Delta Phi Sorority, Inc., emphasized that "violence is preventable" and highlighted further steps individuals, organizations, and communities can take to combat sexual violence.

ORIENTATION 2021

From January 16 - 17, 2021, Lambda Phi Epsilon chapter leaders gathered virtually on Zoom over Martin Luther King Jr. weekend to refine the skills necessary to lead their chapters. "Threads of LiFE" became a central theme for weaving conversations centered around the growth and resilience of the organization.

On the first day of Orientation, District Governors facilitated virtual breakout rooms for attendees to make new ties and better connect the social fabric of the fraternity. The Executive Cabinet of the International Board presented skill shares on a variety of chapter operations, ranging from virtual recruitment to crisis communications to developing leadership pipelines. To move the needle of collective development forward, the Minnesota Chapter of the National Association of Asian American Professionals also presented a workshop and discussion on how rising leaders may navigate privilege in their personal and professional pursuits.

New Member Educators received their own specialized training on the second day of Orientation, as the Fraternity continued to make updates to the Noble Brother Program. The accessibility of this year's virtual format allowed for more brothers and alumni to engage with live dialogue beyond the annual attendance of chapter presidents. Over 224 registered fraternity leaders attended the 16 hours of live-streamed programming split across two days.

Besides talking about general recruitment and process ideas, we discussed an important aspect of our NME program: vulnerability and Asian American advocacy. Both are crucial topics to inform the new members in order to strengthen the bond between the new members and actives and learn how to raise Asian American awareness as an organization.

Over the past 12 months, the International Board of 37 officers logged in over 10,925 hours of service for advancing the fraternity, and officers were recognized with Presidential Volunteer Service Awards (PVSA) via AmeriCorps and Points of Light. In 2003, the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation established the President's Volunteer Service Award to recognize the important role of volunteers in shaping America. Led by the AmeriCorps and managed in partnership with Points of Light, this program allows certifying organizations to recognize their most exceptional volunteers.
